



Privacy policy

The kind of information about you that we might collect and store includes: Personal information, such as name, address, contact numbers, date of birth, notes on medical history, history of treatments, your signed client agreement, and invoices and receipts. We will use these details to provide you with our services. We keep records for 7 years.

You have the right to ask to see the information that we hold about you, please ask us and you can view it in a session. You can ask us to change any information we hold about you that is incorrect. You have the right to ask us to delete any information that we hold about you, which we will do, save for that which we have a legal obligation to keep.

Our Privacy Notice and consent form also refers to processing. Processing includes using your contact details to send you newsletters or other marketing materials.

As a result of a change in UK law, we now need your consent to how we contact you.

Where you do not grant consent, we will not be able to use your personal data for marketing purposes (so for example, we may not be able to let you know about open days or special offers). We will still be able to use your personal data for: yours or our legitimate interests in connection with the provision of health care services to you; or if necessary in compliance with a legal obligation which our practice/clinic is subject to. These lawful uses of your personal data not requiring your consent are set out in our Privacy Notice.
